DES MOINES (AP) — Franz John Wood, 92, pioneer Des Moines threshing machine manufacturer and inventor, died at his home here early Saturday.

He had been ill about nine weeks and the cause of death was believed to have been complications of pneumonia.

Services have been tentatively set for 3 p.m. Monday.

Wood leaves a daughter, Helen, of Des Moines, a son, Richard, of 1846 Third avenue SE, Cedar Rapids, and three grandchildren.

Wood and his brother, the late R. L. Wood, started making harvesting machinery in 1893 and later founded the nationally known Des Moines firm of Wood Brothers Inc.
